Good afternoon Census Partners,

This past Thursday, June 27, the Supreme Court ruled that the current reasoning supplied by the Department of Commerce for including the citizenship question on the 2020 Census was insufficient to justify its inclusion. This means that, for the time being, the citizenship question cannot be included on the 2020 Census.

However, this leaves the future of the citizenship question somewhat undecided, as it is possible that <u>an alternative</u> reasoning could be offered and lead to the inclusion of the question in 2020 or in future Census years.

The administration has previously stated that July 1st, 2019, is the latest possible date that printing could begin if they are to be prepared for the enumeration in 2020, and this would not leave sufficient time for the question to be re-litigated before printing. Democratic senators <a href="https://person.org/have-urged-Secretary-Wilbur Ross">have urged Secretary Wilbur Ross</a> to move ahead with printing the 2020 census materials without citizenship question included.

In the meantime, we celebrate this small victory and step in the right direction towards a Complete Count in 2020. Early testing has <u>already shown</u> that the inclusion of the citizenship question would significantly decrease participation in 2020, which would
